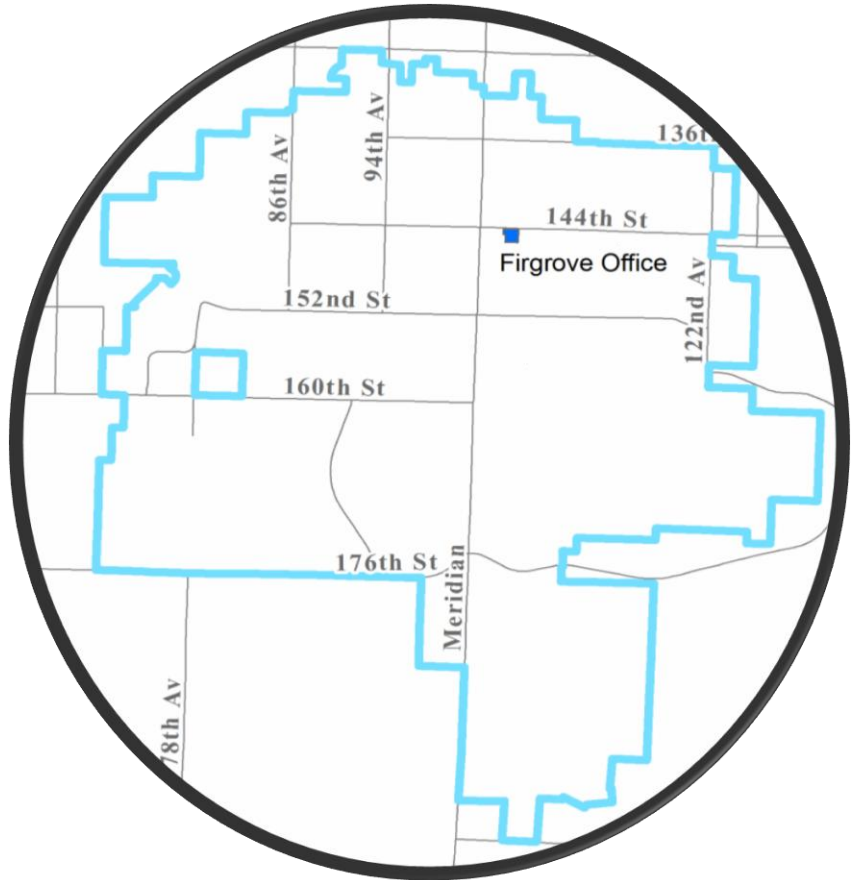

Yearly Backflow Testing

Residential backflow testing notices were recently mailed, and a completed and passing backflow test is due by June 15, 2017. The test is required on an annual basis by the State of Washington per WAC 246-290-490.

Did you know that Firgrove offers a backflow testing option that is both convenient and affordable?

Customers can sign up with Firgrove to have their backflow assembly test completed automatically every year and have the test fee applied directly to their water bill. The fee may vary each year based on contractor bids. For the current year the fee is \$19.00 per test. To sign up, simply complete and return the Automatic Backflow Testing and Right of Entry Agreement.

This form can be found on our website www.firgrove.org and in our office.

This is a voluntary program. You may also schedule your test with an independent contractor. A courtesy list of some companies with BAT certifications can be found on our website or in our office.

Firgrove reads customers' meters once every two months. Plants and debris sometimes grow around or fall onto the water meter. Firgrove asks that you occasionally remove any excess debris on the meter box and/or trim any brush back that may have grown around it. This makes it quicker and easier for the service technicians to reach and read your water meter.

When you wash your car be mindful of where your suds may end up. When washing in the driveway, things like soap, dirt, and oil drain into our storm water systems and eventually make their way to our lakes, rivers, and oceans. This year you could try using a car wash where the used water flows into a sanitary sewer system, or you could wash your car on your lawn where the grass can filter the excess water before it makes its way to the drains.





Trying to Save Water This Summer?



A large amount of the water is used during the summer months watering lawns. This usage can cause higher bills and can be detrimental if there is a shortage of water and a drought was to occur during the warmer months. To help reduce usage, keep your bill low, and conserve water, you can follow a watering schedule based on the calendar seen below.

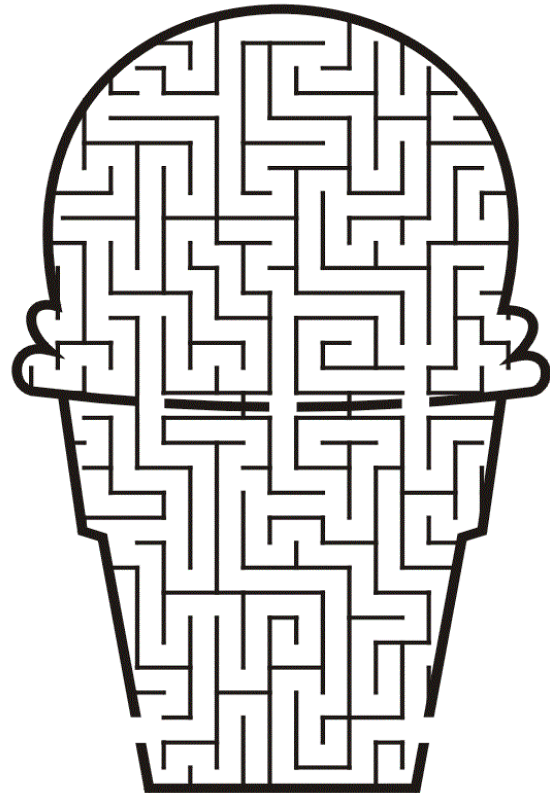
